My visit to the Victoria Police Museum










I will cross a zebra crossing. I will stay close to my adult. I may see police cars and police!



I will go up the stairs or escalators. There is also a lift. I will stay close to my adult.




The Victoria Police Museum is at the top of the stairs.

There are some things in the museum I can touch.






There are other things that are just for looking at.
